

British Museum, London

This leading art institution, located in central London, is offering virtual tours on its website. Its permanent collection is among the largest and most comprehensive in the world, and comprises over eight million artworks, which were primarily sourced during the era of the British Empire. Guests can explore the museum's Great Court and discover the ancient Rosetta Stone and Egyptian mummies among others.






Musée du Louvre, Paris

The world's most-visited art museum, known for its rich collection of masterpieces by Italian Renaissance painters, including Leonardo da Vinci's Mona Lisa is currently, offering virtual tours of its artworks such as the Egyptian antiquities and paintings by Delacroix, Rembrandt and Tintoretto.







Shrine Empire, New Delhi

Shrine Empire presents and promotes contemporary visual art practices. The gallery has organised an online exhibition 'Speculations on a New World Order,' curated by Anushka Rajendran, which includes works by artists such as Afrah Shafiq, Anupam Roy, Bhagwati Prasad and Chandan Gomes. The exhibition will be available for viewing from April 15 to May 20, 2020. The show has been conceived specifically for digital viewing, and several of the works have been adapted for the platform.


Vatican Museums, Vatican City





Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York City


